In Science, **Grade 2** have been learning about materials.








Luke adopted a sea turtle. He spoke about Cory and all about sea turtles to Grade 2.

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Having lots of fun developing our computing and computational thinking skills through a range of activities in **Computing Club**!














Here are some pics of **Grade 5**. We are learning about Nelson Mandela and the children were asked to identify important events of Nelson Mandela.s along a timeline.
