PRIMARY NEWS:

It's been an exciting two weeks in the primary school, with the Olympic celebrations going on. Children have discovered new sports, new limits, new team-mates, new feelings and even new idols!

Have a look later in the newsletter to see photos of some of the things that we have been getting up to.

As well as celebrating our Olympics, we have of course also been following our usual timetable, whenever we can, and on Monday, <u>Grade 2</u> presented an all singing, all dancing show for us, all about endangered animals. We learnt all about orangutans and pandas and they read us a super rhyming story together too.



The Grade 2s finished their amazing assembly with a song in French about different animals.

At the end of the assembly, we had time for class teachers to hand out certificate of merit and Mr Hanrahan awarded the house point trophy to the house team that had collected the most points during the first two weeks of the half term.



The house point totals were really close, but it was the green team that came out victorious this time, with 815 house-points. Andrew, **the Green House** Captain, proudly collected the trophy, and added one more sticky trophy to the tracker!



During the ISB Olympics, we have been visited by not one, but two athletes, that will be competing in this year's games! Last week we were so excited to welcome *Mallory Franklin* – a Team GB Olympic silver medalist, who will be battling for gold in both the Women's Slalom Kayak (K1) and Women's Slalom Canoe (C1) events in the summer. Then this week, following Miss Chris' exciting news last Friday, her son *Alex Baldoni*, who won an important Pan-American race in Brazil last week to secure his Olympic spot, came to visit us this Thursday. He will be competing in the Men's Slalom Canoe (C1) for Team Canada!

Both athletes talked to us about training, pressure, feelings and dreams and they gave us some really honest insights into the life of an athlete. Mallory Franklin spoke about how important self-belief is, and explained that as a child, she was so shy, that she wouldn't answer her name when the register was called in class. She said that she could never have imagined that she could be an Olympic athlete! Alex Baldoni told us that it will be his first Olympic Games and he is just so happy to have won his place that although he will try his best to win, more importantly, he wants to really enjoy the whole experience – what a great attitude!

Some of the children presented Mallory with a card and a picture of Pau (with some kayaks on the gave), and Alex was presented his own ISB Olympics t-shirt, and his first Olympic gold medal – an ISB one!


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

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Reception have loved exploring maps, finding out what all the different symbols mean and all the information we can find out from maps. They had fun using google earth to explore places they have been to before too!



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
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In Art **Reception** have been exploring and creating Repeat Patterns through printing with various objects. Their results are fabulous (2), there may even be some future designers.

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

Choosing GCSE Subjects

Students have had taster sessions for English Literature and Business Studies since these are subjects that they do not study in KS3. They have also discussed the range of subjects and choices sin their PSHE lessons this week.

Parents will receive FULL details of the options available in the Options Booklet that will be distributed on 26 March at the Parents Evening. At 16:00 a presentation will be given by the Head of Secondary outlining the Options process, and by Head of Core subjects; all of our staff will be available for appointments from 16:30 onwards. Booking forms will be sent out early next week.

Initial option choice forms must be returned to Mrs Byrne by Weds 03 April.

Discussions with individual students and either Ms Byrne and Mr Pearse will take place before and after the Easter, and parents will be informed of final confirmed option choices in May.

Revision

Each week, I will add the main points from the revision focused assemblies that we have covered with G10 -13 students. I'm always very happy to support students if they need more help, and they are very welcome to come to the Library after school on Mondays and Fridays.

How to Plan your Revision

Step 1: Create a Plan

Use syllabus content info (available online or already given by teachers), to RAG* your topics/chapters. This will give you a focus of the red and amber topics for your revision. Then,

- Print a free downloadable calendar (I suggest week view), add your exam date
- Work backwards from the exam dates planning when you will revise specific (identified) topics, and for how long. Make sure you are setting yourself manageable goals!

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Step 2: Revise using your plan

Step 3: Test yourself. You may want to use flashcards or exam questions for this

Step 4: Review your plan each week to check your progress and to adapt your plan if your testing shows you need more time on specific topics

* RAG = if you are confident and really know & understand a topic mark is as Green

If you're not absolutely sure of a topic, mark it as Amber

If you've really no idea about a topic, mark it as **Red** (and also make a note to speak to your teacher about this topic for some extra support/explanation)

Revision - What to Avoid

Today, with 48 days until the first external exam, the G12 and 13s assembly focused on revision and in particular, what to avoid. The 4 main 'avoid' recommendations are:

- 1. Mobile phones
- 2. Listening to music, especially music with lyrics
- 3. Cramming revision as opposed to spacing it out and swapping between topics
- 4. Not getting enough sleep
