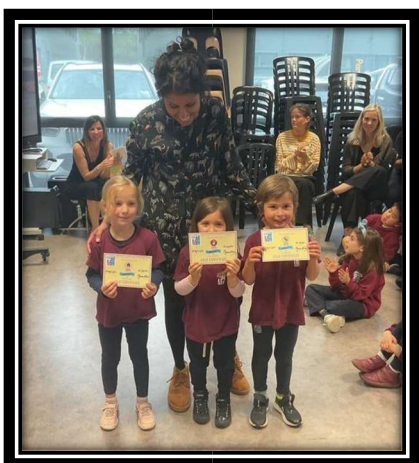

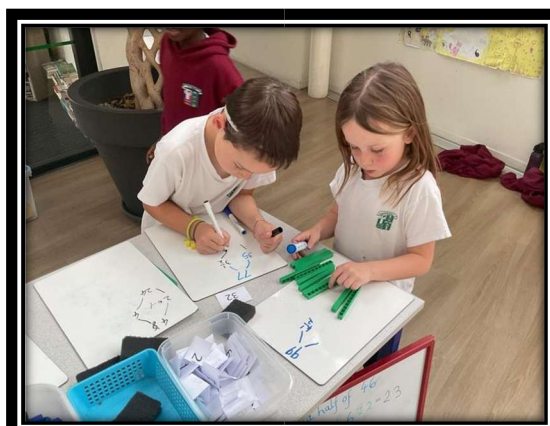
Once they were given a quick tour of where to find what in the médiathèque, the children were free to have a wander, read a few books, and even choose one to borrow.

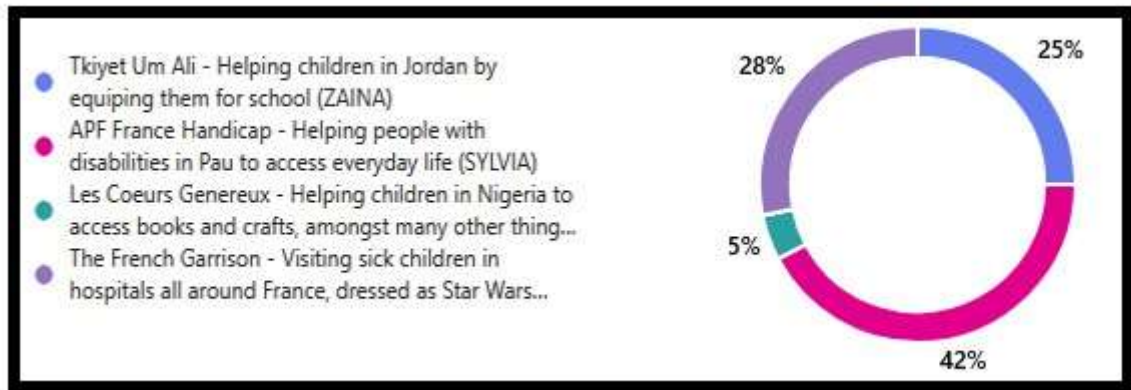

**Grade 5** enjoyed revising the written methods they needed for the arithmetic test by playing a fun game of Blooket





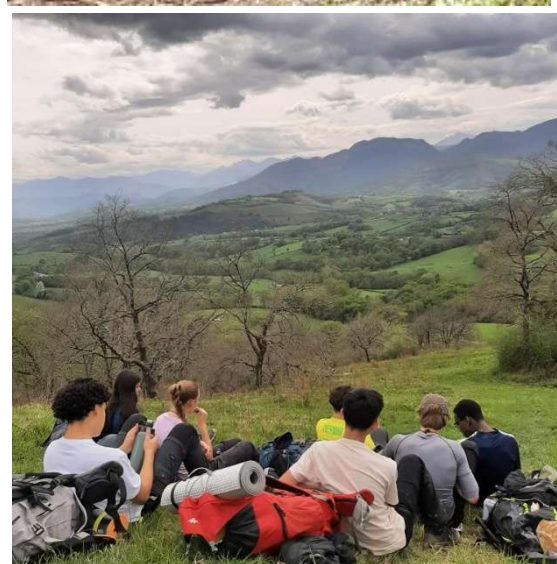
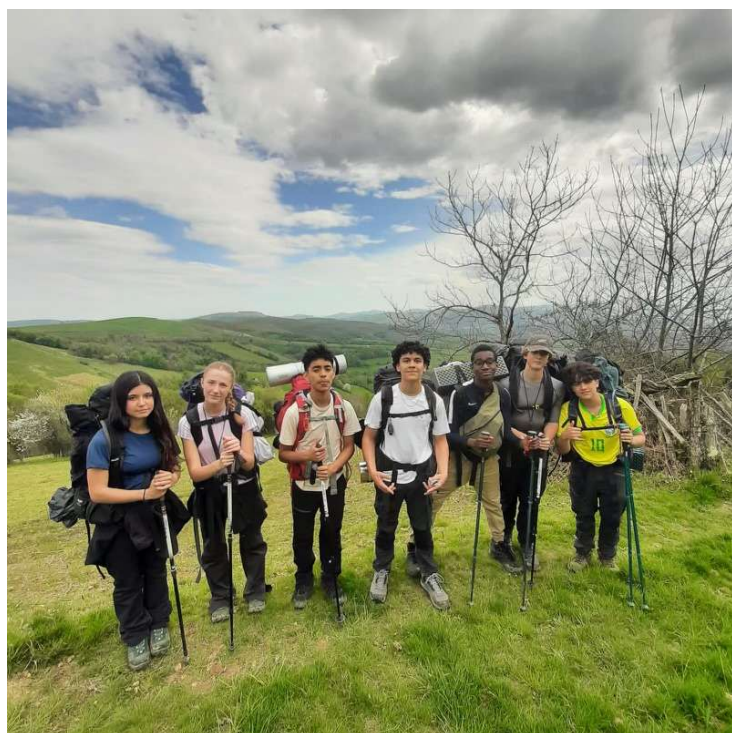
