PRIMARY NEWS



Welcome to all children, parents and teachers. We wish you all a fantastic year 2025-2026. A very warm welcome and we hope you have an enjoyable and rewarding time at ISB.

It's been a busy start to the year in the Primary School, with students and teachers alike returning to school with great enthusiasm. The students that are new to the school, have been welcomed by their classmates and already seem to be very settled in their classes. We'd like to give a special mention to the new Early Years children who have all been so brave throughout this first week and a half, especially as, for some of them, it's the first time that they have been left by their parents. After just one week, there are already signs of inspiring work being produced all around the school and we'd like to invite you all to the **Primary Open Evening on Thursday 11th September**, during which you will be able to see some of this work, and have an informal chat with your children's teachers. It is a great opportunity also for your children to show you their new classrooms. All parents are welcome to visit the school, with their children, **between 15.30 and 17.15** on this day. This is not a time to talk to the teachers about your individual child's progress, however, as always, if you do feel that you need a meeting, you can arrange another time for this with the teacher.

On Monday, we had our first whole school assembly, and even the brilliantly behaved Reception class joined us — It was encouraging to see that the children remembered the behaviour expectations during the assembly, as they all sat beautifully and were quick to contribute when asked. During the assembly we reflected on our favourite part of the first day of school so far — There were lots of different things from across the school, from meeting new friends, to enjoying Mr Luis' delicious pasta bolognaise for lunch!

Mr Hanrahan then reminded us of a few playtime rules, before reading The Hungry Caterpillar to us. Whilst he was reading it, he asked us to think how this could be relevant to our first day of the year. At the end of the story, he revealed his tenuous link – We are like the caterpillar at the start of our school year, and we need to 'eat' lots of knowledge, in order to finish the year as a beautiful butterfly/brainbox!





A fun filled start to the year for **Grade 5!**





Learn how to activate your Firefly account, log in for the first time and reset your password if needed.


Overview

Use the instructions below to activate your Firefly account and log in for the first time.

Activating Your Account

Follow the steps below to activate your account:

- 1. In your browser, navigate to isbearn.fireflycloud.net
- 2. Your username is either of the parent emails that you have registered with the school
- 3. Select **New to Firefly? Activate your account**.




- 4. Enter the email address/username then select **Activate account**. An email is sent to you.
- 5. Check your email inbox. Make sure to check your spam filters if you don't find it anywhere.
- 6. Open the email and select **Activate Account**.
- 7. Enter the password of your choice, then confirm it.
- 8. Choose Activate Account.
- 9. Your account is activated and you're now logged in to the FireFly Parent platform.

Logging In for Activated Users

To login to Firefly after you've activated your account, follow the steps below:

- 1. In your browser, navigate to the FireFly Parent platform isbearn.fireflycloud.net
- 2. Enter your credentials directly on the main screen and select Log in.

3. If you are asked for a school code it is ISBEARN all in upper case.




Resetting a forgotten password

- 2. Enter your username or email address. This must be the address that is registered with Firefly.
- 3. Choose Reset password.
- 4. In your mailbox, follow the reset link that was sent to you to choose a new password.
