They then read us the story of Michael Recycle, who just loved to recycle and helped a whole town to change their attitudes in order to make a big difference to their town.






It was such an important message and as we are not the only ones who use our school grounds, the student council have arranged to present the same assembly to the secondary school, so that they can work with us too!

Early Years: Last week, Early years had lots of fun exploring activities inspired by pumpkins!

In art, they had a go at observational drawings of pumpkins and they also enjoyed working together on a giant pumpkin collage.




