PRIMARY NEWS

Since the last newsletter, Winter has well and truly hit; the mountains are blanketed in snow, the festive season is popping up around us, and, in true seasonal fashion, a round of winter flu is making its way through our school community.

Awesome Assemblies

In a break to our usual schedule, we have had the honour of Miss Heather hosting our last two assemblies.

In the first one, Miss Heather showed us a photograph of a pearl, and a few children explained how pearls are formed – a pearl is made when a tiny piece of grit settles inside an oyster. This is very annoying to the oyster (a bit like when we get a pip stuck in our teeth) so it makes a liquid (a bit like saliva in our mouths) to cover the grit and make it more comfortable. Over time, this builds up around the piece of grit and it becomes coated in a strong, shiny coat and turns into a pearl.

We then read a story about a girl called Pearl, who sometimes found it hard to make the right behaviour choices, and because of that the other children started to leave her out of games and be a bit mean to her. This made Pearl really sad.

The class teacher had an idea and the whole class agreed that if someone was making a bad choice, instead of getting annoyed with them, they would encourage them to think again and make the right choice. They also agreed to congratulate each other when a good behaviour choice had been made. Very





quickly, Pearl realized that she loved to receive compliments and started to try harder to make the correct choices. As Pearl's class were trying their best to congratulate positive behaviour choices, the whole class started to feel more positive, and the playground games became much more inclusive. Pearl was so happy, and although she still sometimes made mistakes, like we all do, she began to love school again!

We realized at the end, that Pearl in the story was a little bit like a piece of grit and hadn't found her potential, but through kind words and actions she changed, just like a real pearl changes from grit into a precious object in the ocean.

For the following week, we decided to try especially hard to think about the feelings of others and be kind to each other, even if it's difficult sometimes. Perhaps then we could all be pearls?



As if that exciting moral-adventure wasn't enough, this week, Grade 5 treated us to a magical retelling of the Inca myth *Birth of the Stars*. In Science, the students have been learning about how we get day and night, and this myth is one of the stories ancient peoples told to explain this daily mystery.

They brought to life the tale of a powerful wizard who draws a great black curtain across the sky each night. The performance followed a group of artists who used this curtain for their shadow shows...until a curious little moth nibbled a tiny hole in the darkness and created the very first star.











Grade 5 worked beautifully together to show how wonder, creativity, and curiosity might have shaped the night sky we know today.



Mock Exams

All students should attend school as normal during mock exams. Students will follow their regular timetable when they are not in exams, and it will be the subject teacher's choice whether the students spend their time revising independently, have a structured revision lesson, or continue with subject content. This is essential because for some subjects there are external in January.

Students should always be in school throughout the mock exams (28 November -12 December) unless we have an email from parents to request time out of school for a specific RDV.

And to remind you of the general exam rules; these have been shared with students:

- No talking at any time in the exam room (even before or after your exam)
- No phones or smart watches
- No cases on calculators

- No notes or revision material
- Pens/pencils in clear/see through plastic bag or pencil case
- Only clear water bottles with any labels removed

Anyone who is suspected of cheating or communicating with another student will be given a zero score for the exam.

- Gender stereotypes and their impact
- Healthy relationships
- Empowerment

We are also hosting a parent seminar that is opened to all ISB parents, of both Primary and Secondary students which offers a great opportunity to better understand the pressures that boys are facing, particularly online. The seminar is on Monday 15th December and will start at 16:00, lasting for approximately 1 hour.
