
Assembly

Grade 1 painting their holiday recounts







Grade 2 kicked off the new term with some twisty fairy tales. We met a very bossy king and a very sneaky giant!




Booking a Parents Evening Appointment


Please note: there is currently a bug in our booking system that will allow one parent to book multiple appointments for the same time – please make sure that you choose different times for your appointments.
